We think of people who have dark and sad times in their lives. *Blow out one candle*

We remember how our world sometimes judges people, discriminates or ignores people, leaving them alone and in the dark. *Blow out final candle*

Without the love of God, we can too easily live in darkness. Lord Jesus Christ, light of the nations and glory of Israel: make your home among us, and present us pure and holy to your heavenly Father, your God, and our God. Amen

God forgives you, forgive yourself, forgive others and live in peace. Amen.

We relight the candles as a sign of our forgiveness and intent to lead a good life.
